CL101 Developing Your Leadership Potential

Identify the personal strengths and skills you bring to your community and ways to build upon them. Learn how to best use your assets to broaden your community impact.

CL102 Keeping Your Balance

Explore setting realistic goals and work-plans that others in your organization will accept. Develop skills to help you prioritize your work and sustain yourself for the long haul.
